CALL FOR APPLICATIONS No. 02/2022 – INITIATIVE “RESEARCHERS AT RISK” OF FGV SAO PAULO LAW SCHOOL / FAPESP

1. INITIATIVE “RESEARCHERS AT RISK”

1.1 The FGV Law School is inviting applications within the [“Researchers at Risk” initiative](#), whose purpose is to promote collaboration between researchers for the development of research projects by providing awards for visiting researchers (up to 12 months) and fellowships for postdoctoral researchers (up to 24 months). Awards/Fellowships will be, funded by São Paulo Research Foundation (*Fundação de Amparo à Pesquisa do Estado de São Paulo “FAPESP”*).

1.2 The initiative aims to protect professors and researchers from countries involved in the conflict in Ukraine and other war-affected countries, under the terms of the [FAPESP call for proposals](#).

1.3 FGV São Paulo Law School declares its engagement as one of the host institutions in the state of São Paulo, to receive researchers at risk. FGV São Paulo Law School will offer a constructive academic environment, committed to ensuring the continuity of their research in a favorable situation and integrating visiting and postdoctoral researchers into its academic community.

1.3.1 During the term of the award, visiting researchers will be allowed to:

1.3.1.1 Access FGV São Paulo Law School facilities;

1.3.1.2 Access FGV libraries’ databases;

1.3.1.3 Use FGV São Paulo Law School Computer Room;

1.3.1.4 Participate in collective activities at FGV São Paulo Law School, notably the faculty workshops, researchers’ meetings and activities conducted at the research centers;

1.3.1.5 Collaborate in academic activities of the FGV São Paulo Law School, including offering short-term courses to FGV São Paulo Law School students and researchers.

1.3.2 Postdoctoral researchers will be welcomed into the [Global Fellowship Program](#), designed to improve training in research and publication. The activities offered include research seminars, discussion groups, and research methodology workshops with the participation of FGV professors and visiting professors.

2. DEVELOPMENT AND SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS

2.1 Professors and postdoc researchers at risk should contact FGV São Paulo Law School professors (Annex I), informing their interest and availability to apply for the initiative.

2.2 FGV São Paulo Law School professors will support the development of proposals to be submitted to FAPESP.

2.2.1 FGV professors’ research agendas to which research projects can be placed in dialogue are indicated in Annex I.

2.2.2 Researchers at risk may also contact FGV São Paulo Law School professors who are not mentioned in Annex I but are interested in the joint development of proposals.

2.3 The proposal prepared jointly between the researcher at risk and the FGV professor must be submitted exclusively through the SAGe System

(www.fapesp.br/sage), attaching the documentation indicated in the guidelines of each support opportunity.

2.3.1 All the documents necessary for the submission of the proposal are available at the [FAPESP call for research proposals](#).

2.4 The deadline for submitting research proposals in this Call is August 30, 2022.

2.4.1 Submitted proposals will be evaluated through the peer review system.

2.4.2 FAPESP will determine the beginning of the award/fellowship.

² The themes are included in the following projects:

“International Economic Law by Other means”: This research project is coordinated by a partnership between the Getulio Vargas Foundation, the Federal University of Rio Grande do Sul and the Federal Rural University of Rio de Janeiro. It focuses on legal arrangements applied by non-central economies to promote their transnational economic relations. The aim is to investigate, describe, and analyze their features in a specific context and compare them to other legal structures from central or non-central economies. In 2022-2024, this project focuses on the legal arrangements promoted by Chinese outbound investments in non-central economies. Australia, Brazil, India, Nigeria, Russia, and Uzbekistan are local researchers' case studies under development. The Brazilian National Council for Scientific and Technological Development (CNPq) supports this initiative (2022-2024).

“New trends in investment regulation with international impact”: This project is linked to the previous analysis of Reconceptualizing International Investment Law from the Global South and the current study of screening mechanisms implementation in developed and developing economies. The countries under investigation are Australia, Canada, China, Germany, India, Japan, Korea, Mexico, Portugal, Russia, South Africa, Spain, the United Kingdom, and the United States. The Brazilian Institute of Economic Applied Research supports this project (2021-2023).

“Critical approaches to international law”: This research project aims to map and analyze theories of international law from a critical perspective, mainly from developing countries or non-state actors' perspectives. Both applied research to specific cases and theoretical research may be part of this project.

³ Themes are included in the project “Law, Development and the Post-Colonial World, which aims to understand the relationship between Law, Politics, Religion and society in the development processes of countries and regions previously or currently subjected to colonization or occupation. Special interest is focused on the processes in the Arab World, in the Muslim World, which involves a significant part of Africa and Asia.
